## **Timeline of Biodynamic Agriculture in the United States (1924-1949)**

(Compiled by M. Gardner, January 2023, for the Agriculture Section)

- **1924, June 7-16: RUDOLF STEINER** gives the *Agriculture Course* in Koberwitz, Silesia (then Germany); 1<sup>st</sup> German edition of Course published already by November (but kept confidential, numbered copies only).
- 1925, March 30: STEINER dies in Dornach, Switzerland.
- 1926 ["soon after 1925"]: First preps made by HENRY HAGENS in Princeton, NJ.
- **1926, April:** CHARLOTTE PARKER on behalf of RALPH COURTNEY and the Threefold Commonwealth Group in NYC acquires 30 acres in Spring Valley, NY (includes house [later "Main House"], barn & orchard).
- 1926, May: GLADYS BARNETT (HAHN) & ELISE STOLTING (COURTNEY) travel to Germany to learn biodynamic agriculture from ALEXANDER (AKI) KEYSERLINGK (nephew of Count Keserlingk) at his farms near Baltic Sea (north of Koberwitz); at Christmas they attend agriculture conference in Dornach.
- **1927:** First informal use of "Demeter" as a brand name; first use of term "biological-dynamic" (*biologisch-dynamisch*); the *Versuchsring* (Experimental Circle) assigns numbers to preps for confidentiality.
- 1927, May: ELISE returns to "Threefold Farm" in Spring Valley and starts BD garden adjacent to Main House.
- 1927, fall: GLADYS returns and with ELISE makes compost piles & BD preps, also buys bees and beehives.
- **1928**, **summer:** CHARLOTTE PARKER & RALPH COURTNEY meet **EHRENFRIED PFEIFFER** at opening of second Goetheanum in Dornach.
- 1928, Dec. 29: COUNT CARL VON KEYSERLINGK dies in Breslau, Germany, on trip to Dornach.
- **1929: GEORGE ADAMS'** English translation of the *Agriculture Course* is published (numbered copies only). First commercial TV station in U.S. begins broadcasting.
- 1929, spring: PAUL STROMENGER, who attended Ag. Course, arrives from Germany to be farmer at Threefold (until 1933).
- 1929, fall: GLADYS starts BD farm in Dover Plains, NY (Dutchess Co.) with her new husband BILL HAHN.

  ELISE marries JOSEPH COURTNEY [RALPH'S brother] (daughter CHARLOTTE later marries PETER DUKICH.)

  Stock market crash.
- **1930:** Pluto discovered.
- 1931: Empire State Building finished. George Washington Bridge opened.
- 1932: Heath hen (large chicken-like bird) becomes extinct (last colony on Martha's Vineyard).
- 1933: ADOLF HITLER becomes Chancellor in Germany. FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT becomes U.S. President.
- 1933, July: First anthroposophical summer conference at Threefold (tent behind "summer kitchen" [site of present "Holder House"]); PFEIFFER invited to speak. EVELYN SPEIDEN (GREGG)'S first conference
- 1933, Nov.-Dec.: EVELYN goes to BD conferences in England, Germany & Dornach, meets ERIKA SABARTH,

  DICKIE (MATHILDE) VON FRAGENSTEIN (VIBBER) and ERIKA RIESE (who teaches her to make the BD preps);

  (in spring 1934 also visits Pfeiffer's large "Loverendale" agricultural project in Holland).
- 1934: After spending time in Holland and Switzerland, FRED & ALICE HECKEL become the farmers at Threefold Farm.
- 1935, Apr. 14: "Black Sunday" black blizzard in Oklahoma at height of Dust Bowl era.
- 1935: Threefold Farm acquires "new land" (including the present "Red Barn"); now milking a dozen cows.

  PFEIFFER returns to U.S. for lecture tour with GÜNTHER WACHSMUTH and HERMANN VON BARAVALLE.

  Schism in *Vorstand* of Anthroposophical Society, some members expelled; Society banned in Germany by Nazis.
- **1936:** Hoover Dam completed on Colorado River.
- 1937: ROGER & MARION HALE acquire 12,000 acres of forest near Vanceboro, ME, start BD "Sunrise Farm" and eventually a lab for Pfeiffer; make BD preps, also for others. (This lab moves to Threefold Farm in 1947.)
- 1937, Apr. 10-11: First BD conference in U.S. at Threefold Farm; PFEIFFER as guest speaker.

- **1938, Feb. 2:** BDFGA founded in NYC with Board of **ORA F. GARDNER** (President), ROGER HALE (Vice-President), FRED HECKEL (Secretary/Treasurer), and **F. LANGDON DAVIS**.
- 1938: PFEIFFER'S *Bio-Dynamic Farming and Gardening: Soil Fertility, Renewal and Preservation* is published (translated by FRED HECKEL); first BD textbook (Ag. Course not yet public); also appears in German, French, Dutch & Italian. At Threefold, construction of Orchard House begins. <a href="LOUIS BROMFIELD">LOUIS BROMFIELD</a> buys 600-acre Malabar Farm in Ohio.
  <a href="WILLIAM ALBRECHT">WILLIAM ALBRECHT</a> becomes chairman of the Dept. of Soils at the Univ. of Missouri.
- 1939: 37 BD farms & 31 BD gardens in U.S. <u>JOHN STEINBECK's The Grapes of Wrath published.</u>
- 1939, Mar. 18-19: Third annual BD conference at Threefold Farm; 175 attendees.
- 1939, Sept.: Germany invades Poland, WW II begins.
- 1940: LORD JAMES NORTHBOURNE publishes *Look to the Land*, which introduces the term "organic" agriculture (inspired by Pfeiffer and BD agriculture). <u>ALBERT HOWARD publishes *An Agricultural Testament*, which inspires J.I. RODALE to establish an organic gardening experimental farm on 63 acres in Emmaus, PA.</u>
- **1940, fall:** PFEIFFER with wife (**ADELHEID**) and 2 children moves to U.S. to start BD training course and manage 838-acre "model farm" for **ALARIK** (& **MABEL PEW**) **MYRIN** in Kimberton, PA. BDFGA moves to Kimberton; ALARIK MYRIN and PFEIFFER (as science advisor) join Board; EVELYN becomes Secretary/Treasurer.
- **1941:** First issue of *Bio-Dynamics*. In Germany, Nazis ban BD agriculture (after RUDOLF HESS' flight to England). **1941, Dec. 7:** Attack on Pearl Harbor, HI.
- **1942:** PFEIFFER & RIESE'S *Grow a Garden and Be Self-Sufficient* (translated by ALICE HECKEL).
- 1943: MAX & MATHILDE ZINNIKER start 140-acre BD farm in Elkhorn, WI. LADY EVE BALFOUR publishes *The Living Soil*.
- **1944:** ERNST & MARGARET DANIEL become farmers on Threefold's "new land" (sell raw milk until early 1970s).
- **1944, March:** PFEIFFER parts ways with MYRIN; no BD conference due to wartime gas rationing. With **PETER ESCHER'S** help PFEIFFER acquires 285-acre "Meadowbrook Farm" in Chester, NY. BDFGA relocates to Chester.
  - [In 1958 BDFGA moves to Dover Plains, NY, & in 1963 to Stroudsburg, PA (following **JOSEPHINE PORTER**); in 1972 to Springfield, IL (**MICHAEL SCULLY**); in 1977 to Wyoming, RI (**HEINZ GROTZKE**); in 1985 back to Kimberton (**ROD SCHOULDICE**); in 1998 to San Francisco, CA, & in 2003 to Junction City, OR (**CHUCK BEEDY**); and in 2011 to Milwaukee, WI (**ROBERT KARP**)].
- 1945, Aug. 14: PFEIFFER hospitalized with tuberculosis in Pomona, NY (until 1947). WW II armistice.
- **1946:** Annual BD conferences resume at Threefold Farm.
- 1947: PFEIFFER moves to Threefold, sets up Lab above Orchard House garage (regularly visits farm and family in Chester), develops "compost starter," with help from MARGRIT SELKE, ERIKA SABARTH, SALLIE BURNS and DICKIE, who now marries HOWLAND VIBBER. WALTER & URSULA STUBER start "Golden Acres," a 370-acre model BD farm near Newtown, PA.
- 1948, Jan. 30: MAHATMA GANDHI assassinated.
- 1949: PFEIFFER'S Lab moves to east wing of newly built Threefold Auditorium (Lab closes at the end of 1974).

- 1952: MARJORIE SPOCK & POLLY (MARY THEODORA) RICHARDS start BD garden on Long Island (Brookville, NY).
  1957, summer: DDT spraying program begins on Long Island; MARJORIE & POLLY sue to stop it. Suit unsuccessful, but RACHEL CARSON becomes involved in 1958 and then in 1962 publishes *Silent Spring* (yet for political reasons does not publicly acknowledge immense help of MARJORIE & POLLY or PFEIFFER). (DDT banned in U.S. in 1972.)
- **1958:** First public (unnumbered) edition of the *Agriculture Course* in English (first public German edition only in 1963).
- 1960: MARJORIE & POLLY buy 142-acre farm next to Pfeiffer's farm in Chester (move to Maine five years later).
- **1961, Nov. 30:** PFEIFFER dies at Threefold Farm.
